Dear Parent,

We are happy to inform you that we have all settled in nicely for the new session and what an exciting time we are having.

We welcome our new friend Daniel to Toddler Group 1; you are in for a great learning adventure. We promote learning through play and we feel very strong about creating a safe and caring environment for every children.

We celebrated our National Day on the 4th of October and our class represented the South-West region. The children were all beautifully dressed (all thanks to our parents). We all had so much fun as we presented the culture of the South Western region; we sang and danced to Yoruba songs.

Our theme for September was “All about me” and we learnt so much about ourselves; our name, age, Gender, Name of School and class, favourite toy, food and Identification of family members (mummy, daddy, brother and sister). Our goal is to make every child gain self-confidence and grow both socially and emotionally. In Literacy, we have made rote reading A-Z our daily routine, we can make our make phonic sounds with the associating objects: s as in sun, a as in apple, t as in table, p as in pencil, n as in net, i as in igloo (and not ice-cream).

Also our identification and making the letter sounds ‘a-j’ has not been left out.

We are progressing daily in our Numeracy from rote counting 1-10 to counting 1-20 and my friends are making me proud daily with their scribbling skills. Most of us can now identify the colour ‘Red’ and shape ‘Circle’.

Some of us have learnt to say good morning, goodbye and also use our magic words {please, excuse me, sorry, thank you and pardon me} when appropriate. We have also learnt a lot of new rhymes. The children are always excited during nursery rhymes session and are never in a hurry to stop singing.

We are getting better at building the pink tower, fixing the coloured circle disk and using the dressing frame (zipping) appropriately. Also tucking in and out our chairs before and after use is now a norm in the classroom. All these activities will help develop our eye-hand co-ordination and help make us independent children.

A LOOK AT NEXT 2 WEEKS

The theme for this month October is “My Body and I”, we would be learning:

- Parts of the body.
- Our 5 sense organs.
- In Numeracy, we would progress to counting 1-25 and identifying numbers 1-5, Identification of the square shape, identification of colours blue and yellow.
- In Literacy, rote reading A-Z, identification of a-k with their associating objects and tracing on a sand tray.
