Dear Parents,

Welcome to Year Two

It's hard to believe but it's that time of the year again – the beginning of a new school year. There is so much excitement ahead as we begin to explore new books, new activities and concepts. I look forward to you sharing in all these exciting times.

Our aim is to ensure that the children experience a smooth transition into Year 2. The year two curriculum builds upon and extends the experiences that children have had in year 1 which will prepare them for self-confidence. The children will be taught broadly in line with the Nigerian / British curriculum, exploring experimenting and learning new concepts.

Our theme for this month is National Issues e.g. Election, fuel scarcity, road constructions and security which are timely and current event that will really help the children to relate local, national and world happenings.

Numeracy: we've reinforced the previous work done in year 1 and diving right into numeration and notation, describing numbers in figures and words, odd and even number and ordinal numbers, students definition of measurement and methods of measurement.

Social Studies: We are working and learning more about the three major ethnic groups in Nigeria, their language, food, festivals, marriage and traditional attire.

In Literacy we are working with the use of articles 'a' 'an' and the (definite and indefinite articles, use of adjective and writing instructions. In Creative Writing, we wrote on "how I spent my last summer holiday. We've also improved in our reading, handwriting, spelling, and dictation.

Geography classes are also on going well as we are looking at different land forms (mountain, plain, hill and valley); History is fun as we've been learning about Chief Obafemi Awolowo and Mary Slessor, their time and achievements. In Basic Technology, we're learning about colours (definition, types and importance of colours...)
